Redevelopment underway at Jupiters Hotel & Casino

Jupiters Hotel & Casino's planned \$345 million transformation is underway. When complete, development will include the new six-star hotel tower, contemporary restaurants and bars, and the complete transformation of all existing facilities.

Work began this week on a new poolside experience complete with private cabanas and an ultra-modern bar. Two of the property's seven restaurants, Osteria Vivo and entwine, will be closed this month to make way for exciting new dining concepts. The iconic Gold Coast institution will also take on a new look with exterior painting works to be completed by Christmas.

Managing Director Queensland Geoff Hogg said the team is excited to get the redevelopment of Jupiters Gold Coast underway and looks forward to sharing all the details with the local community.

"Enjoying the perfect Gold Coast weather is a part of what makes this destination so appealing, so it made sense to start our transformation outdoors," he said.

Geoff said the multi phased redevelopment is being handled carefully to ensure a world-class project is delivered, while causing as little disruption to guests as possible.

"With all developments, there comes some short term disruption but we promise the end result will be well worth it," he said.

Geoff said it's an exciting time for the Gold Coast with investment taking place across the city and 2018 Commonwealth Games preparations in full swing.

"We are thrilled to be a part of this resurgence, and will be working closely with our precinct and wider Gold Coast partners to make sure Jupiters continues to play an integral role in making this beautiful city a must-see destination," he said.

"Echo Entertainment Group is committed to creating a world-class integrated resort, which will boost tourism and one which locals will be proud of.

"Echo's commitment to South East Queensland is unequivocal, and the redevelopment work starting today represents our long term investment and commitment to Queensland being an international tourism magnet."

The refurbishment of the existing 592-room hotel and early works on the new six-star luxury hotel tower will commence within the next 12 months.
